An Introductory Guide to the Construction & Demolition Waste Management Plan for the CALGreen Building Code

New CALGreen Building Code

On January 1, 2011, the new California Green Building standard code (Title 24—Part 11—CALGreen) becomes effective. CALGreen applies to new buildings for residential and commercial projects. Typical buildings covered in this code are: state-owned, low-rise residential (up to 3 stories), commercial, public elementary & secondary schools, hospitals and community colleges.

This guide is intended to help contractors / owners/builders understand the requirements of Section 5.408.1 –5.408.4 which refers to the new requirement for a Construction Waste Management Plan (CWMP) and to the mandatory 50% diversion for Construction and Demolition (C&D) debris.

This requirement must be met to obtain a building permit and a certificate of occupancy.

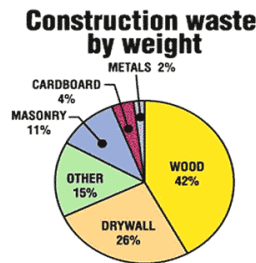
IS YOUR PROJECT REQUIRED TO CREATE A CWMP AND MEET THE MANDATORY 50% DIVERSION REQUIREMENT?

C&D debris accounts for a significant amount of tonnage going directly to landfills. Currently 17% of waste disposed at the Golden Bear Transfer Station in Richmond is C&D. CALGreen states that a Construction Waste Management Plan (CWMP) must be

completed for any **NEW building being constructed and a minimum of 50% of the debris be recycled and or salvaged for reuse.** The demolition debris provision of the code

may be applicable if an existing building is going to be completely torn down and a NEW building built on the same site, where both are considered to be part of the same project.

While this Code does not make it mandatory for all construction projects to divert 50%, we encourage you to do so. Contact the building or planning manager in the city where the building will be constructed, for further information. As of this writing, remodels, renovations and additions are not required to meet this new code. However, stay tuned for future changes to the building code.



STEPS TO MEETING THE REQUIREMENT

Step 1: Find out if your project is required to meet the new CALGreen Code. Contact your city's building or planning department.

Step 2: Fill out the CWMP form that is found on the city's website or get them from the City Building/Planning Department. For help with calculating the amount of waste produced in typical building projects go to www.ccrecycle.org.

Step 3: Turn in the completed form with your other required permit documents.

Step 4: Reduce, Reuse & Recycle at your building site. Call *RecycleMore* for assistance at 510-215-3104.

Step 5: Save your disposal and recycling receipts and turn them in with the *CWMP Report—Post Construction* that is required for final occupancy.
